	- knowledge of diplomatic protocol and etiquette, diplomatic and
	consular service, diplomatic documentation;
	- proficiency in at least one foreign language at an intermediate to
	advanced level.
Communication skills	A career in international relations usually involves a competent and clear expression of thought, active interaction with government officials, heads of organizations, employees and the public, both directly, in writing, and through videoconferencing and telephone conversations.
Analytical skills	Creative thinking allows to find innovative solutions to complex
	problems.
	Skills in rigorous data analysis are required, as access to
	comparative data is required, which can be important in making
	an informed diplomatic decision.
	Critical thinking is used to carefully evaluate information and use
	the knowledge gained to make an informed decision.
Conducting	The balance between maintaining the position of the organization

Teamwork	Often, decisions made at the international level involve multiple stakeholders. Teamwork involves the ability to brainstorm and choose the most optimal solution, even if it did not correspond to the initial personal vision.
Management	Independent management and control of the processes of labor and educational activities.
Digital Skills	Modern public diplomacy requires diplomats to be active and transparent in the information space. Future diplomats also need the skills to create media content, maintain an account, and create meaningful posts.
